Don't you hate it when this happens?

I'm basing this off Ubuntu's default history behavior

- Was that session written to the history already?
- When did I enter this command?
- But how long did it take?

The solution: Atuin

<https://atuin.sh/>

- Written in Rust (latest fad!)
- Writes history to an SQLite DB, <3 SQLite

Simply press `CTRL + r` to bring up your history for a quick search

Metadata

Press `CTRL + o` to see metadata of the selected command. Statistics about usage, durations, when it was run

Context

Press `CTRL + r` to switch between different contexts

- global
- host
- session
- current directory

Text Search

Press `CTRL + s` to switch between text search modes.

- fuzzy, not as good as fzf's in my opinion, but the rest more than makes up for it
- prefix
- substring
- skim, seems to be similar to fzf's syntax

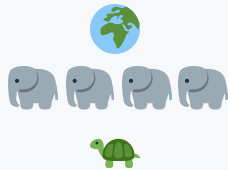
Search command
